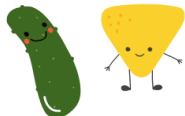



Any change in transportation (car or bus), daily or weekly, always notify your child's teacher in writing.

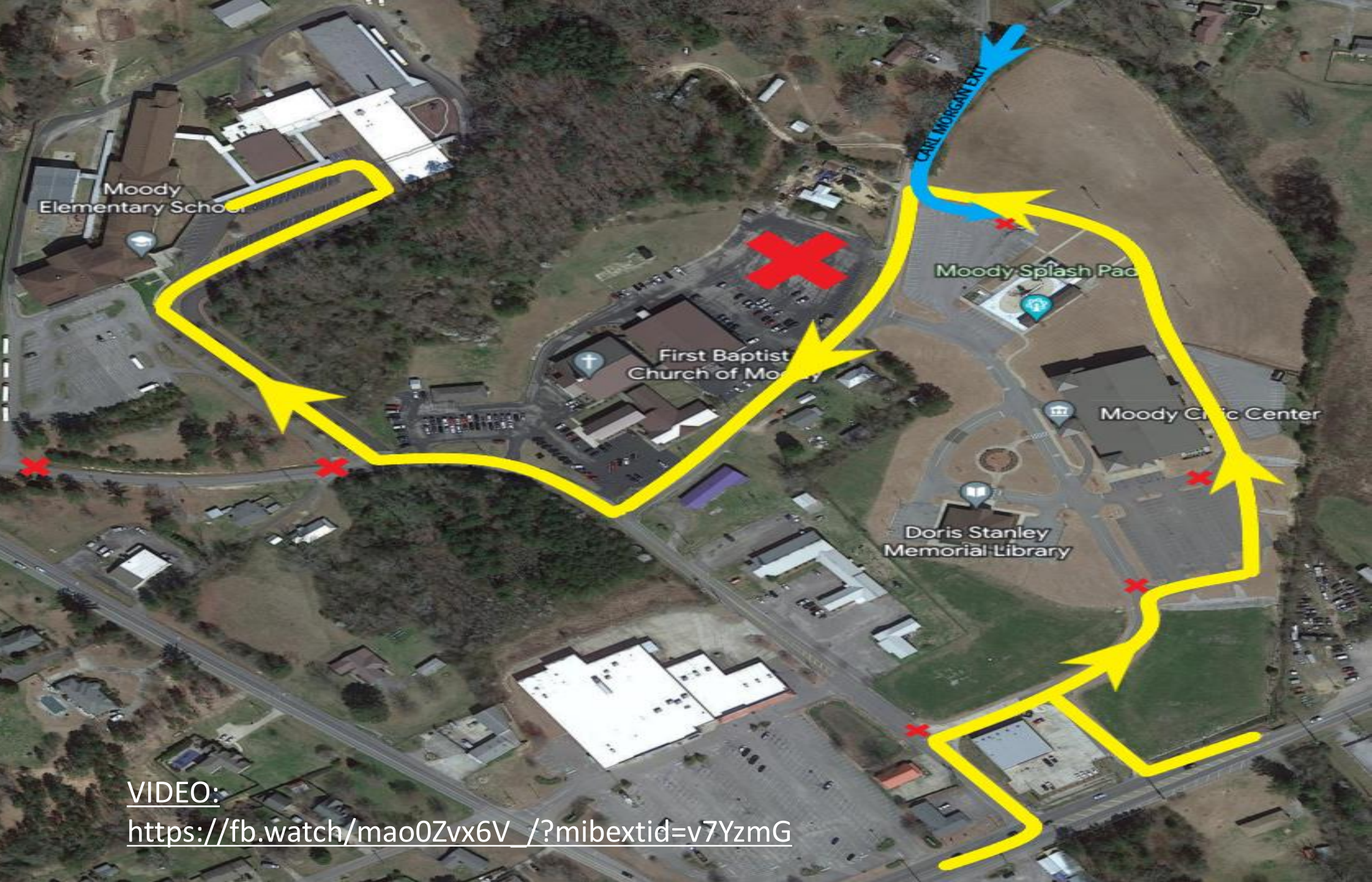

- When using the paper application, the following tips will help guide you:
 - The last 4 digits of SSN of the person completing the app **OR** the **NO SSN** box **MUST** be checked
 - Application **MUST** be signed
 - The number you enter for *Total Household Members* should match the total number of people listed on the application.
 - Refer to the instructions for a definition of *Child Income*. Pay attention to what *Child Income* means and do not list adult income in the child income section.

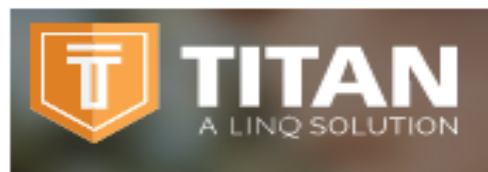

Moody Elementary School Updated Volunteer Policy

The school volunteer process is now a three-step process with the St. Clair County Board of Education. All steps below must be completed at least two weeks prior to the event in which you want to volunteer.

1. Online Background Check- Please complete the online background check application using the link available at sccboe.org. Visit the volunteer tab for more information and links.
2. Volunteer Agreement Application- Please complete the Volunteer Agreement Application located at sccboe.org on the volunteer tab.
3. Email or deliver the Volunteer Agreement Application to mesregistration@sccboe.org.

All three steps must be completed in this order to release the online background check.

Please check the expiration date on your background check. You must reapply every year. This must be completed annually to attend MES field trips.

Attendance Policy:

(Please note: The 23-24 St. Clair County Code of Conduct has reduced the number of “parent excuses” for the school year from 10 to 8.)

Students are permitted 8 parent excuses per year.

For an absence to be “excused”, parents/guardians must present to the school principal or designee a written explanation of a student’s absence **within three (3) days of the absence. Failure to present a written explanation will cause the absence to be recorded as unexcused.**

Students are permitted 8 parent excuses per year. Any excuse after that point will require a medical or legal excuse.

Excessive absence is defined as any absence over **(8) days for a student in grades K-12 per school year without proper documentation.** Days of absence exceeding **8 days** must be documented by a physician’s statement or by a court order to be considered excused. A parent/guardian note of explanation can be accepted for **8** total absences during the school year. Absences without physician or court documentation beyond these numbers shall be considered unexcused absences.

The St. Clair County School System participates in cooperation with the St. Clair County District Attorney and the St. Clair County Juvenile Court in the Early Warning Program for Attendance Intervention and the Early Warning Program for Behavior Intervention to assist families in achieving good school attendance and students in maintaining good conduct.

1st unexcused absence- Information Letter

3rd unexcused absence- Reminder Letter

5th unexcused absence- Referral to Early Warning Court

7th unexcused absence- Conference with Juvenile Probation Officer

10th unexcused absence- Referral to Juvenile Court

St. Clair County Code of Conduct Attendance Policy

- Students are permitted 8 parent excuses per school year. Please note that this is less than last school year.
- Any absences after the 8 allowed parent excuses will require a medical or legal excuse or the absence will be recorded as unexcused.
- A written request to excuse an absence must be presented within (3) days of the absence. Failure to present a written explanation within (3) three days will cause the absence to be unexcused.
- Remember, As soon as your student returns to school after an absence, send the excuse!!!

Is your Child Sick Enough to Stay Home?

Fever: If your temperature is 100° or higher, then stay home. Don't return to your office or school until 24 hours after your fever has subsided. A fever is one of clearest signs of a contagious illness and showing up at school or work will too easily result in passing on whatever you've got to others. If your child has a temperature of 100.5 or greater, you child will be sent home. This should be without Tylenol. Or other Fever aids.

Cough: If your cough brings up mucus or phlegm-type secretions, then stay home. Especially if it has color. A dry cough is OK for school. Regardless of what kind of cough you have, cover your mouth and keep your hands washed. Remember only cough drops with Pectin can be used at school without a medication form. Any medicated cough drops require a medication form signed by the parent.

Sore throat: If it hurts to swallow, breathe or speak, then stay home, or if your sore throat is accompanied by fever. If your voice is raspy or your throat is only slightly sore, then it's OK to show up at work or school. Cough drops may be helpful. Warm saltwater gargles are the best treatment for sore throats.

Runny nose: If you must constantly blow your nose to keep it clear, then stay home. If it's only slightly stuffy, and you aren't having trouble breathing, then it's probably all right to be at work.

Earache: By itself, an earache won't pose a hazard to others unless you work in a job that requires balance (such as being a bus driver, a pilot or a school crossing guard.) But if an earache is accompanied by other symptoms of contagion, you'll need to stay home.

Vomiting: Stay home, of course. And stay home for an additional 24 hours once you have stopped vomiting.

Diarrhea: Follow the same guidelines as vomiting.

Rashes: Contagious rashes like pink eye require keeping your distance from others. Some rashes, like MRSA, can even be deadly if you give them to someone else. See your doctor to learn whether your rash requires you stay away from work or school. Your school nurse will send home your child for any undiagnosed rashes. If your child is itching and scratching to the point they cannot concentrate, please stay home.

There are also some contagious conditions that carry special requirements about returning to school, such as strep throat, pink eye, chicken pox, flu, etc. If your student has a condition or illness that you are unsure about with regards to school attendance, please contact the nurse at your school to get information before sending your child back to school. We want to be a partner in promoting the very highest level of wellness for each student in our school environment.

While having a sick child is a hardship for most families, it is important that parents enact the Golden Rule, Do unto others as you would have them do unto you, in that if you wouldn't want your son or daughter playing with a sick child who exhibits certain illnesses, then the same holds true for them as well. Providers and teachers report that families will often drop off a sick student with a fever or who has just recently thrown up because of work arrangements. That creates not only a major health risk to all students but is terribly unfair to the sick child as well. Plus, recovery time is shorter with a sick patient who is given plenty of rest, and some good TLC. Please keep them at home.

ALABAMA LITERACY ACT

Frequently Asked Questions

FOR K-3 FAMILIES

What is the ALABAMA LITERACY ACT?

The Alabama Literacy Act was passed in 2019 to help improve reading in Alabama public schools to ensure students are reading on grade level by the end of the 3rd grade. Reading is the gateway to lifelong achievement and the students of Alabama deserve a strong start on their path to success.

Why focus on literacy?

By 3rd grade, students must be proficient in foundational reading skills in order to comprehend texts. If they are unsuccessful, they will have difficulty understanding grade level reading material. Students also need strong reading skills in order to learn other school subjects such as science, social studies, writing, and even math.

How will families be informed about their child's progress?

Each student in kindergarten through 3rd grade will have his/her reading assessed at the beginning, middle, and end of the school year. These assessments will identify students who need intensive reading instruction and intervention. These assessments also provide useful information for the teacher to help tailor instruction to meet individual student needs. Families should receive these results in writing within a designated time frame.

What is The Alabama State Board of Education approved assessment that is required for promotion to the 4th grade?

The Board approved assessment is the reading portion of the 3rd grade Alabama Comprehensive Assessment Program (ACAP) English Language Arts assessment. The ACAP summative is a required test for all third-grade students to initiate a path to promotion. Students not demonstrating sufficient reading skills may be retained at the end of 3rd grade, if unable to show sufficient reading skills by one of the other paths to promotion. Your child's school will provide interventions to help your child.

How will schools help students who are retained in 3rd grade because the student does not meet the promotion requirement?

Students retained in 3rd grade will receive more intensive reading intervention services including:

- Offer summer reading camps and Alabama Summer Achievement Program (ASAP) shall be made available to all K-3 students in public elementary schools that are among the lowest performing 5% in reading.
- Offer before or after school intervention tutoring throughout the year to support learning;
- Provide reading instruction that is grounded in the science of reading;

If your child is reading below grade level or is struggling with reading, his/her teacher will inform you of the reading deficits that have been identified.

The teacher will provide your child with additional reading instruction and support, and you will be given strategies to help your child at home.

If your child does not demonstrate sufficient reading skills at the end of 3rd grade, you will receive notification that he/she may not be promoted to 4th grade.

Grade Level Ready Performance Outcomes

Third graders will be promoted to fourth grade if they demonstrate sufficient reading skills through one of the following pathways:

- Score above the lowest achievement level for the ACAP in the spring.
- Earn an acceptable score for the ACAP Supplemental Assessment.
- Master grade 3 Essential Reading Standards in the Student Reading Portfolio.
- Meet one of the Good Cause Exemptions.

Good Cause Exemptions:

Good cause exemptions allow students who are reading below grade level to be promoted to the fourth grade but still receive interventions and other supports. The good cause exemptions include:

- (1) Students identified as English language learners who have had less than three years of instruction in English as a second language.
- (2) Students with disabilities who participate in the statewide English Language Arts reading assessment and who have an Individual Education Plan or a Section 504 plan that reflects that the student has received intensive reading intervention for more than two years and who still demonstrates a deficiency in reading or was previously retained in kindergarten, first grade, second grade, or third grade.
- (3) Students who have received intensive reading intervention for two or more years and who still demonstrate a deficiency in reading and who were previously retained in kindergarten, first grade, or second grade for a total of two years.

**No student shall be retained more than once in the third grade.*

NOTE: Students with disabilities whose Individualized Education Plan indicates that participation in the statewide assessment program is not appropriate, consistent with state law, are automatically exempt from demonstrating sufficient reading skills outlined in this chapter in order to achieve promotion.

***If a student does not demonstrate sufficient reading skills through one of the three pathways or does not qualify for a good cause exemption, the student may not be promoted to fourth grade.**
