Diploma Endorsement Options for St. Clair County Schools Students

Students who entered 9th grade in or after 2013-2014 are provided the opportunity to earn one of the following types of diplomas:

- * Alabama High School Diploma
- * Alabama High School Diploma with Advanced Academic Endorsement (St. Clair County Endorsement)
- * Alabama High School Diploma with Advanced Career Tech Endorsement (St. Clair County Endorsement)
- * Alabama High School Diploma with Career Tech Endorsement (St. Clair County Endorsement)

Graduation Requirements

These are the requirements to graduate:

- 4 credits each in English, math, science, and social studies
 - Math must include Geometry with Data Analysis, Algebra I with Probability, and Algebra II with Statistics. Student who complete Accelerated Math in both 7th and 8th grades may replace the Algebra I with Probability credit with an upper-level math.
 - Science credits must include Biology and either Physical Science or Chemistry.
- * 1 credit Beginning Kinesiology (P.E.)
 - Can substitute Athletics, Marching Band, or JROTC
- * 1 credit Career Preparedness (9th grade)
- * 0.5 credit Health (10th grade)

- * 3 credits in any combination of career technical, foreign language, and/or fine art
- Remaining credits required may be electives of the student's choice
- * College and Career Readiness Indicator (beginning with the Class of 2026)

Alabama College and Career Readiness (CCR) Indicator Required for Graduation for Class of 2026 and Beyond

- 1. ACT with Writing Benchmark (11th grade year)
 - a. Achieve a score in ANY of the following ACT sections:
 - i. English 18 or higher
 - ii. Reading 22 or higher
 - iii. Math 22 or higher
 - iv. Science 23 or higher
- 2. ACT WorkKeys Benchmark (12th grade year)
 - a. Score a 4 or higher on all 3 subtests to earn a Silver National Career Readiness Indicator
 - i. Applied Mathematics
 - ii. Workplace Documents
 - iii. Graphic Literacy
- 3. Career and Technical Education (CTE) Industry Credential
 - a. Complete a CTE class and pass the credential test
- 4. Career and Technical Education (CTE) Completer
 - a. Complete the foundation class for the pathway
 - b. Earn 3 Credits in a CTE pathway (can include the foundation class)
 - c. Earn a grade of 70 ("C") or higher in all classes
- 5. Dual Enrollment Credit
 - a. Complete an academic dual enrollment class with a grade of 70 or higher
- 6. Advanced Placement (AP) Exam Qualifying Score
 - a. Score a 3 or higher on any AP exam
- 7. Military
 - a. Committing to and enlisting for active duty in one of the various military branches

Honors Courses

- Carefully consider your child's academic strengths and interests when choosing these courses. Not every student excels in every subject area and that is okay!
- We want and expect every student to challenge themselves to perform at the highest level possible.
- To be successful, a student should be studying, reviewing notes, writing an essay, or working math problems each night.
- Honors courses are designed to prepare students to take
 Advanced Placement courses. These courses require students to
 complete more work at a higher level using more critical
 thinking skills than a regular course.

DUAL ENROLLMENT COURSES

- The Dual Enrollment program allows high school students to enroll in college courses and receive both high school and college credit for the same course.
- Such arrangements allow students to meet the requirements for high school graduation while simultaneously earning college credit.
- It is strongly suggested that students have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 and meet any other requirements for specific courses in order to participate in this program. Students with at least a 2.5 GPA may register with the approval of the counselor and the principal.
- Students should consult their prospective colleges and universities to determine if the credit is accepted by that college or university.
- Students are required to pay college tuition for Dual Enrollment classes.
 Tuition (approx. \$500) is due for the first semester before the school year begins. Tuition (approx. \$500) for the second semester is due on the first school day in January.

SCHEDULING OPTIONS FOR DUAL **ENROLLMENT COURSES**

The ALSDE has implemented a one-to-one credit option for dual enrollment courses. As a result, we have some new scheduling options for US History and English.

HISTORY 10th Grade 11th Grade

Option 1 (Recommended for most): **US History I** HIS 201* & 202

*HIS 201 would be for elective credit and will not replace US History I credit/grade earned previously.

HIS 201 & 202 Option 2: elective course of

student's choice

ENGLISH 11th Grade 12th Grade

English 11 (AP or general) ENG 101* & 102 Option 1 (Recommended for most):

*ENG 101 would be for elective credit and will not replace English 11 credit/grade earned previously.

Option 2: ENG 101 & 102 elective course of

student's choice

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) COURSES

- AP Courses are approved by the College Board and are designed to provide college level studies for high school students using college level materials and strategies.
- Amount and depth of material requires students to read and write extensively in and out of class.
- Rigor of material requires students to develop advanced reasoning and problem-solving skills.
- Students enrolled in AP courses are required to take the associated AP exam at a cost of \$97 (subject to change).
 Students should consult their prospective universities to determine individual course exam qualifying score.

Eden Career Technical Center

- Mostly for juniors and seniors
- Students ride the bus to Ashville and are there for half of the school day.
- Cost is between \$70 and \$100 per year (based on program).
- Applications and an interview are required.

Weighted Credits

- Honors courses will be awarded 0.5 extra quality point. (Example: A grade of 90 A will earn a student 4.5 quality points instead of 4.0.)
 - Will be awarded 5 numerical points on the numerical GPA if all requirements are met (including taking exam if required).
 - Current MHS courses in this category:
 - Honors English 9 and Honors English 10
 - Honors Geometry with Data Analysis and Honors Algebra II with Statistics
 - Honors Biology, Honors Chemistry, and Honors Physics
- AP (Advanced Placement) or Dual Enrollment courses will be awarded one (1)
 additional quality point. (Example: A grade of 90 A will earn a student 5.0
 quality points instead of 4.0.)
 - Will be awarded 10 numerical points on the numerical GPA if all requirements are met (including taking the AP exam).

 - AP Seminar, AP English Language, AP English Literature, and Dual Enrollment English 101/102
 - AP Precalculus and AP Calculus
 - AP Biology and AP Chemistry

Course Scheduling Process:

- The school's master schedule is built based on the course requests of almost 700 students.
- Before selecting courses, check the prerequisites and academic instruction levels in the curriculum guide found at mhs.sccboe.org.
- Return the signed course request by Thursday, March 21, 2024.

Course Scheduling Process

- General information and instructions regarding the course scheduling process are provided to all students during large group sessions with counselors.
- Students make selections and return signed Course Selection Sheets to their **ENGLISH** teacher by Thursday, March 21, 2024.
 - 8th grade to the MJHS Office
- Parents approve students' choices by signing the Course Selection Sheet.
- Any student not returning a course selection sheet by Thursday, March 21, 2024, forfeits the right to choose his or her classes.
 - Those students not meeting the deadline for turning in their Course Selection Sheets will not receive priority status in the scheduling process.

- The MHS counselors will check course selection sheets to be sure that the necessary courses are being requested and will discuss issues with students as necessary.

NOTE: NO COURSE CHANGES WILL BE MADE AFTER APRIL 30, 2024. This includes during the summer, at registration, and after the school year has started. Because of this, careful consideration should be used in the selection of courses.

(Every summer, we get phone calls from parents whose children decided they did not want to do the Honors or AP English summer reading and want to be in regular English instead. This is too late to make a schedule change.)

- Registration will take place during summer. Students
 will pick up schedules for the 2024-2025 school
 year at a designated date in July. At this time,
 students also will return the necessary registration
 information and purchase parking permits,
 yearbooks, etc.
- Please remember that the student's schedule reflects the choices made by the student and approved by the parent during the course selection process in the spring. The master schedule will have been constructed and teachers will have been assigned based on these choices. Therefore, requests to change schedules will not be honored.

Other Information

- In order to meet the requirements for Carnegie Units (credits), students must be in school. You have a limited number of parent excuses for the year. If you know your child is going on a mission trip, family trip, or any other trip, save your parent excuses.
- After 18 total absences, a student is considered to have chronic absenteeism. A student can fail for missing this many days.
- Your child cannot make up any work or tests occurring during an unexcused absence.
